Learning Activities:

Activity #1:

Create a diagram comparing the size and color of each of the three kinds of skunks found in the United States.

Activity #2:

Draw or paint a picture of a skunk in its natural habitat.

Activity #3:

Research skunks and create an interesting facts sheet about them.

Activity #4:

If you were a skunk, what would your “grocery list” look like?

Activity #5

Draw or paint a picture of two of the skunk’s predators. (Yes, skunks do have predators!)

3. Do skunks hibernate? If not, how do they conserve their energy in the winter?
4. Why do skunks do handstands?

8. Why are skunks black and white?
